

Vision Statement


HomeAid's vision is to be a vital force in creating safe and dignified housing and programmatic facilities for those who are experiencing or at risk of homelessness.



Statement of Need

Colorado's homelessness problem is not only growing but intensifying, affecting the lives of thousands of individuals and straining resources across various sectors. Denver has the fifth-largest homeless population in the nation with a total homeless population of 9,065 in 2023 – a 32% increase.

“The biggest thing is finally getting out of homelessness. We provide safe and dignified housing and programmatic facilities for those experiencing or at risk of homelessness.

- BeyondHome** | Renovation of 22 townhome units and construction of affordable housing project, all housing families. Arvada.
- L'Arche** | 2 single-family homes with 6 bedrooms that will be home to individuals with and without intellectual disabilities. Fort Collins.
- Safe Shelter of St. Vrain Valley** | Adding 3 bedrooms to an existing home serving individuals escaping domestic violence and trafficking. Longmont.
- Providence Network** | Renovating outdoor play area for children. Denver.
- Tennyson Center** | Interior renovation of 7,800 sq. ft. residential building adding 16 beds for the Children's Habilitation Residential Program. Denver.
- Third Way Center** | Interior demolition and renovation of 6,000 sq. ft. home adding 14 beds for adolescents with complex health issues. Englewood.
- Integrated Family Community Services** | Renovation of the food pantry. Englewood.
- Tall Tales Ranch** | 2 residential buildings with 14 apartments for adults with I/DD and a community building and coffee shop. Lone Tree.
- Hope House** | Replacement of ramp railing and deck on residential home. Arvada.
